- The competition is open to all accordionists irrespective of gender and nationality, with the aim of promoting musical culture and encouraging young musicians.

The distinction between the sections will focus exclusively on the selection of the repertoire to be carried out:

- Classical music for section I (Classical).
- Pop music/popular for section II (Variety).

Both original pieces and interpretations are allowed in the Competition. Memory execution is not mandatory. Calls for the performers will be made in alphabetical order. Those who are not present at the time of their call may be heard at the end of the other performances, subject to the final decision of the Artistic Director. The performer, at the time of their call, must present to the jury two copies of the pieces being performed. The contestant, by accepting to participate, guarantees that, in case they present an original piece, the same does not affect any rights of authors cited and not cited in the filing of the passage itself, indemnifying the Organization from any liability towards third parties. The faculty of the Organization may enter the pieces performed during the competition into a compilation CD or collection of scores or midi files without owing anything to the authors in addition to the regular copyright due.

COMMISSION AND SELECTION OF PARTICIPANTS

- All applications received will be accepted.
- Lack or incompleteness of the required documents or failure to comply with any of the procedures laid down in this notice and regulations will result in exclusion from the competition.
- Auditions will start at 10:00 am on 23 September, 2023.
- The decisions and judgments of the Judging Commission are final, indisputable and cannot be appealed.

The Judging Commission of the 1st International Competition of Accordion will consist of:

Vincenzo Abbracciante, Saria Convertino, Michele Fedrigotti, Marie-Andrée Jeorger, Eugenia Marini. (Secretary of the Commission: Francesco Zaccaria)

Attached is a short summary of each Member of the Commission.

The Judging Commission can:

ask the competitor to complete all or part of their performance of the programme, or only part of it, if the available time is exceeded. The Commission will draw up the final ranking for the award of the winners of all sections and categories, adopting the the following assessment method:

1st place with score from 95 to 100/100; 2nd place with score from 90 to 94/100; 3rd place with score from 85 to 89/100; A special award will also go to the highest total score for the entire competition.

- A certificate will be given to all participants.
- The Judging Commission may award additional special prizes or divide the prizes in the event of joint winners.
- The highest scoring performers for each day will perform in the two evening concerts on their respective days during which the prizes will be presented. The music scheduled in the concerts will be chosen by the Judging Commission among those presented. Failure to participate in the concerts will result in the withdrawal of any prize.
- In case of the inability to present prizes to competitors or their delegates, they shall remain with the Organisation of the contest until those entitled to the prize contact the secretariat of the competition to agree the presentation arrangements.
 The concert winners of the categories (Classic, Variety) will be guests of honour at the Accordion Festival on 16-17 August,

CURRICULUM VITAE OF JURY MEMBERS

EUGENIA MARINI

Eugenia Marini graduated in cello, and after a considerable artistic experience as a cellist in the Angelicum Chamber Orchestra of Milan, she dedicated herself to the development and enhancement of concert accordion, an instrument with which she had begun her musical studies.

Winner of prestigious international awards, she has performed in numerous concerts in Italy and abroad, both as a soloist and in chamber ensembles She always performs music from the Baroque and 20th century repertoire achieving great success with audiences and critics.

She has performed as a soloist with many great chamber orchestras and Italian symphonies.

Eugenia Marini has recorded CD's for EMI Classics and RDS Sipario.

She has participated with Milva on a tour in the most prestigious Italian and German concert halls, and has also promoted an intense cultural action to promote the classical accordion, promoting international workshops and conferences.

She was awarded the "Carlino d'oro" in Castelfidardo in recognition of her career.

In 2022 she was awarded honorary citizenship by the Municipality of Cevo (Brescia).

MICHELE FEDRIGOTTI

Michele Fedrigotti was born into a family of musicians, and completed his musical studies (diplomas in piano, composition, conductor and harpsichord) at the Conservatorio "G. Verdi" in Milan. He carries out an intense musical activity, as a pianist, composer, conductor, harpsichordist, teacher and organizer, while dedicating particular attention to F. Chopin and improvisation.

He has taught piano and related subjects at the Civica Scuola di Musica in Milan, various Conservatories (Lecce, Piacenza, Alessandria, Novara, Ferrara, and Milan amongst other schools).

For a decade, he was the pedagogical and artistic director of the Vivaldi Academy in Locarno (CH), and long time president of the Kairòs musical association. From 2014 to 2018 he was the artistic director of the Milano Classica Chamber Orchestra and is now president of the Crescendo Orchestra Association.

Michele Fedrigotti has collaborated with many major organizations and institutions and famous artists from different fields.

MARIE-ANDRÉE JOERGER

Marie-Andrée Joerger graduated in accordion with honours at the Musikhochschule in Freiburg in Germany with Teodoro Anzelotti, and a Masters in Contemporary Music of Basel in Switzerland.

She performs all over the world as a soloist in major festivals: Zelt-Musik-Festival in Freiburg (Germany), ÖGZM in Vienna (Austria), Upol Festival in Nova Gorica (Slovenia), Colmar International Music Festival (France), Festival Folia in Montreal (Canada), Festival Musica et Arsmondo in Strasbourg (France), Festival Manifeste de Paris, Les Musicales de Normandie (France), and the Akordeono Festival in Vilnius (Lithuania).

She is a guest soloist in various orchestras such as: Philharmonic Orchestra of Freiburg, Nancy, and Strasbourg, and the National Philharmonic Orchestra of Russia. She has performed in prestigious halls such as: the Konzerthaus and the Philharmonie in Berlin, the Tonhalle in Zurich, the Opéra in Lyon, the Alte Oper in Frankfurt, the Roman Theater in Bucharest, and the Philharmonie in Paris.

Her first solo album, Bach en Miroir, was released in April 2021 under the Klarthe label, with many positive reviews (Rai3, France musique, Le monde, and Mediapart).

Active in contemporary creation, Marie-Andrée Joerger has performed as a soloist and in ensemble world premieres such as Thierry Escaich's first solo accordion work at the Berlin Philharmonic, but also works by Bernard Cavanna, Darniel D'Adamo, Martin Matalon, Misato Mochizuki, Alberto Posadas, Annette Schlünz, Raphaël Cendo, Aurélien Dumont, Andy Emler, and Alekandros Markéas.

Passionate about chamber music, she is the artistic director of the ensemble Les musiciens de Strasbourg and performs in a duo with Vincent Dubois, principal organist at the Cathedral of Notre-Dame. She is a member of the La Philharmonie de Poche, of the contemporary ensemble Linea, and is regularly invited by the Accroche Note ensemble of Strasbourg.

Marie-Andrée Joerger is Professor of Accordion at the Conservatoire and the Académie Supérieure de Musique de Strasbourg (Haute Ecole des Arts du Rhin). She holds masterclasses in several conservatories in Europe (Italy, Lithuania, Slovenia, Poland, and the Netherlands), and is regularly invited to preside over several international competitions (Germany, Italy, Poland, and Switzerland).

VINCE ABBRACCIANTE

Vince Abbracciante – accordionist, composer, arranger and producer.

He has performed in five continents playing with leading musicians: Javier Girotto, Gabriele Mirabassi, Fabrizio Bosso, Juini Booth, Peppe Servillo, John Medeski, Richard Galliano, Marc Ribot, Flavio Boltro, Carlo Actis Dato, Bruno Tommaso, Giovanni Amato, Lucio Dalla, Ornella Vanoni, Heidi Vogel, and Francesco Lotoro.

In 2011 he was awarded the prestigious "VOCE D'ORO" prize by the International Festival of Castelfidardo. In 2013, he was awarded the ARGOJAZZ festival in Marina di Pisticci (MT) for "best instrumentalist 2013". Since 2017, the plaster cast of his right hand has been kept at the "Museum International des Empreintes de Pieds d'Accordéonistes" Recoaro Terme (VI).

In 2018 he won the Bucharest International Jazz Competition with his trio.

In 2021, with the Terranima album, he won the Orpheus Award as the best accordion jazz record production.

"He is the rising star of the accordion in Italy, gifted with a remarkable technique, a deep sense of the blues and swing. He is an accordion master like few others and plays all musical genres with talent." (Dizionario del jazz italiano, 2014) Richard Galliano said of him: "The one who impressed me the most is a young Italian, originally from Puglia: his name is Vince Abbracciante. In every song he embarked me on a story and moved me." (Jazzman, 2005)

SARIA CONVERTINO

"The rising star of the accordion" (Alfredo Gasponi, Il Messaggero, 2010)

Saria Convertino was born in Mottola, land of the ravines in the Apulian Murgia, on 1 August, 1987. She was struck by the sound of the accordion, and when she was eight, she started playing music for fun.

In 2008 she graduated from the Santa Cecilia Conservatory in Rome in Accordion, with full marks, honours and honourable mention, under the guidance of Pitocco. In 2011 she completed the two-year specialist course with honours. In 2013 she graduated with honours with a mention in the Chamber Music Biennium.

In 2015 she specialised in the Master II Level in Interpretation of Contemporary Music with full marks She attends master-classes with Semionov, Murray, Hussong, Shishkin, Angelis, Rantanen, Pica, and Melichar.

Sarah Convertino is the winner of the 56th edition of the Coupe Mondiale in Sturovo, Slovakia (2003).

As winner of the 2011 Prize of the Arts, she performed at the Ravello Festival in the Gardens of Villa Rufolo. In 2010 she won the Rec & Play Competition announced by Cidim, performing at the Academy of Denmark in Rome. She won the Premio Via Vittoria scholarship in 2008, established for the five best

graduate students of the Santa Cecilia Conservatory in Rome and the Soroptimist International National Competition of Italy Talents for music 2009.

Active in the theatre field, she collaborates as an accordionist for various shows, including: Pessoa in Rapsodia with Cosimo Cinieri at the Auditorium Parco della Musica and Rai Radio3; La Guardiana del Faro with Nicola Piovani and Angela Pagano directed by Norma Martelli at the Teatro dell'Angelo in Rome; Pasolini: Rome/Spain (towards Calderòn), on texts by Pasolini with the Lombardi-Tiezzi company; "Maybe my name is Ali" with Sandro Cappelletto at the Teatro di Solomeo, a production by Brunello Cucinelli. She has performed for major reviews in Italy and abroad performing first performances including: Vagabonde Blu by Sciarrino at the Italian Cultural Institute in Paris; Simmu Acqua di Betta, commissioned by the Roman Philharmonic Academy, with the Mancuso Brothers at the Argentina Theater; and Hymen of Stockhausen for electronics, concert music and soloists, at the Gardens of the Philharmonic Academy.

She performs an intense solo concert activity in Italy and abroad, where she performs in prestigious venues such as: Palazzo Montecitorio, Embassy of Egypt, Aula Magna della Sapienza in Rome, the Royal Academy of London, the Academy of Romania, the Royal Academy of Copenhagen, the National Gallery of Modern Art in Rome, Teatro Olimpico, Teatro Eliseo, the Museum of Contemporary Art Macro, Parma Lirica, Sala Casella, the Roman Philharmonic Academy, the Fondazione Arts Academy in Rome, and Campidoglio Sala Esedra of the Capitoline Museums.

The continuous search for beauty has led her to embark on a new path, becoming passionate about the Paths of Italy. From this new interest, the project of creating an itinerant music that generates a link with the territory matures.

She is currently professor of accordion at the Nino Rota Conservatory in Monopoli.
